General Plan Update

The City of Solana Beach is in the process of updating its General Plan. California law requires that each county and city develop and adopt a General Plan to function as the "blueprint" or constitution for its physical development. The General Plan generally serves as a roadmap guiding new development and directing policy actions in a manner that furthers the long-term vision for the community.

The General Plan consists of a series of development policies, diagrams, and text setting forth objectives, principles, standards, and plan policies. The General Plan is the City's constitution for future development and the foundation for all local government land use decisions, which must be consistent with the General Plan.

The General Plan must contain seven state-mandated elements that describe community goals and objectives. The seven mandated elements are Land Use, Open Space, Conservation, Housing, Circulation, Noise, and Safety. Currently the City is working on updating the Housing Element and would like your involvement. 

February 2012 - April 2012

Regular Meetings of the Solana Beach City Council are held at 6:00 p.m. on the second and fourth Wednesday of each month at City Hall, 635 S. Highway 101. Agendas are posted [online](#). Meetings are broadcast live on Cox (channel 19), Time Warner (channel 24 analog, channel 131 digital), AT&T U-Verse (channel 99), and are webcast live and archived [online](#) for future reference. FEBRUARY 2012

- * Authorized an application to the California Energy Commission's EECBG (Energy Efficiency and Conservation Block Grant) Phase 2 Program for grant funds of \$275,000 for the proposed LED Street Light Project - includes LED fixtures for 524 City-owned street lights replacing existing high pressure sodium, low pressure sodium and mercury vapor lamps throughout the City.
- * Approved the release of the draft Initial Study/Environmental Checklist and Negative Declaration for the Plastic Bag Use Reduction Ordinance.
- * Re-established the Local Coastal Plan Ad Hoc Committee (Roberts, Campbell) until February 7, 2013 or until the California Coastal Commission's final adoption of the Solana Beach Local Coastal Plan.
- * Amended the SANDAG (San Diego Association of Governments) 2010 Regional Transportation Improvement Program of projects for Fiscal Years 2011 through 2015.
- * Authorized a reimbursement agreement between the City and Santa Fe Irrigation District for the construction of a 10-inch water pipeline improvement in El Viento.
- * Adopted Ordinance 434 revising Solana Beach Municipal Code Section 11.12.020X relating to leashed dogs in Parks.
- * Re-established the View Assessment Ad Hoc Committee (Heebner, Nichols) until October 21, 2012.
- * Authorized the San Diego County Abandoned Vehicle Abatement Service Authority to place an initiative on the June 5, 2012 ballot to extend fees pursuant to vehicle code sections 9250.7 and 22710.
- * Approved the new City of Solana Beach Off-Street Parking Design Manual with implementation to begin on March 1, 2012.
- * Awarded the General Plan Phase 1 Update contract to Project Design Consultants in the amount of \$200,000.


- * Approved the traffic calming measures proposed on Highland Dr. from Sun Valley Rd. to Via la Senda.
- * Discussed recommendations on updated regulations and conditions for community use of the Fletcher Cove Community Center.
- * Authorized the City Engineer to submit a grant fund application to Caltrans (the California Department of Transportation) for the Cycle 10 State-legislated SRS2 (Safe Routes to School) Program in the amount of \$120,000. The proposed project would restripe Stevens Ave. between San Rodolfo Dr. and Valley Ave.
- * Approved 2012 Housing Element Annual Progress Report.

APRIL 2012

- * Awarded the construction contract for the El Viento/Granados Intersection Improvements and Lomas Santa Fe Dr. Sidewalks, Bid No. 2012-02, to Piperin Corporation in the amount of \$365,870.
- * Approved Chevron Energy Services contract amendment to include a new "cool" roof at City Hall.
- * Authorized a Transmission Capacity lease agreement with City of Encinitas, Cardiff Sanitary Division, for the long-term conveyance of sewage through the Olivenhain Sewer Pump station.
- * Accepted and filed the reissued CAFR (Comprehensive Annual Financial Report) for Fiscal Year 2010-11.
- * Authorized SCOUP (Sand Compatibility and Opportunistic Use Program) State Lands Commission Lease Amendment.
- * Ratified an agreement with LCI Backhoe Services for Emergency Storm Drain Repairs on Highland Drive.
- * Approved support of the San Diego Water Authority lawsuit against the Metropolitan Water District of Southern California.

Planning Division Highlights

Community Development Department



The State of California and local jurisdictions establish criteria for public review of many types of projects. The following is an abbreviated list of the larger projects and proposals that have been presented to the City of Solana Beach for consideration. For more information, contact the City Staff member assigned to the project at the number listed. (All area codes 858 unless otherwise noted)

Draft Local Coastal Program Land Use Plan - On March 7, 2012, the California Coastal Commission (CCC) voted to approve a modified version of the City's Draft Local Coastal Program (LCP) Land Use Plan (LUP). A copy of the March 2012 CCC Staff Report and CCC Staff Recommended (modified) LUP can be viewed [online](#). During the CCC public hearing, the CCC Commissioners made additional modifications to the City's Draft LUP – rejecting CCC Staff Suggested Modifications #129 and #130 relating to the City's existing short term vacation rental policies and modifying Staff Suggested Modifications #66 and #100 pertaining to the impact mitigation fee study completed by the City in 2010. CCC staff are in the process of addressing the changes to the LUP made during the hearing and City Staff are coordinating with CCC staff to finalize the modified LUP so that it can be formally considered by the Solana Beach City Council during a public hearing.

The LCP LUP contains key strategies and policies to provide comprehensive Citywide land use planning and sustainable shoreline policies focused on local conditions, goals and interests. The draft LCP LUP is posted on the [City's website](#). ([Wendé Protzman](#) 720-2439)

Southern California Reef Project at Fletcher Cove - In December 2011, the City hosted a public roundtable discussion at City Hall to discuss the status and future of its reef project and to identify and discuss challenges and opportunities associated with building the structure. The meeting was facilitated by Dr. Richard Seymour, Head of the Coastal Engineering Department at the Scripps Institution of Oceanography at UCSD.

More than 30 residents, surfers, biologists, engineers, and scientists attended the meeting and participated with City Staff and Councilmembers in a productive discussion. Additionally, Federal, State, and regional regulatory agency staff from the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, California Department of Fish and Game, Regional Water Quality Control Board and National Oceanic Atmospheric Administration also participated in this roundtable discussion.

A conceptual engineering design study for the Fletcher Cove Reef Project was completed and is available for public review on the [City's website](#). Also available on the City's website are two peer reviews of the draft report including a review by Dr. Richard Seymour. The City is also in the process of procuring additional Federal and State funds for the next phase of the project which would involve engineering design as well as environmental review and permitting tasks. Regional Beach Sand Project #2 - The second Regional Beach Sand Project (RBSP) is moving forward and will begin placing sand on local beaches in October 2012. The City is expecting approximately 140,000 cubic yards of sand from the RBSP #2. SANDAG has completed the process of securing all necessary regulatory permits needed to implement the project. The Final EIR/EA was adopted by the SANDAG Board of Directors on May 27, 2011, following a 45-day public review and comment period. A copy of the document is available for public review at the Planning Counter at City Hall and can be viewed [online](#).

In 2001, SANDAG initiated the first RBSP and placed 140,000 cubic yards of sand on the City's beaches. Coastal cities that are participating in the second RBSP include Solana Beach, Encinitas, Carlsbad, Oceanside and Imperial Beach. ([Wendé Protzman](#) 720-2439)

USACE 50-Year Shoreline Protection Project - The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers Shoreline Protection Project for Solana Beach and Encinitas, a 50-year beach nourishment and shoreline restoration program, continues to make progress. Updated engineering, environmental and economic studies are underway. The Draft EIR/EIS will be available for public review in 2012 with permitting and final engineering anticipated to occur beginning in 2013. ([Wendé Protzman](#) 720-2439)

Sandy Beaches for San Diego County



Good news Solana Beach! We are part of the SANDAG Regional Beach Sand Project, which will widen beaches from Imperial Beach to Oceanside by adding more than a million cubic yards of clean, high quality sand to the region's eroded shoreline.

Sand placement is scheduled to occur at Solana Beach in

October and take approximately one week, depending on weather or unforeseen delays. Mobilization and demobilization of equipment will occur prior to and immediately following sand placement.

The Solana Beach Fire Department enjoyed working with merchants, vendors, and staff at the recent Fiesta del Sol Street Fair and made it another fun and safe event for all.

During the summer months, the department will be attentive to educating owners of both residential and commercial properties on the importance of providing defensible space, by removing any overgrown or dead vegetation from their properties. The department continues to work with San Diego County staff to ensure overgrown vegetation is properly maintained in fire hazard areas on the north boundary of the City.

CITY OF SOLANA BEACH BANS SINGLE-USE PLASTIC BAGS!

On May 9, 2012, the Solana Beach City Council unanimously voted to ban single-use carryout plastic bags at point-of-sale within Solana Beach. With this momentous vote, Solana Beach became the first city in San Diego County to adopt such a ban. Included in the Ordinance is a grace period for stores to phase out the use of single-use plastic bags and to allow City Staff to conduct outreach activities to provide information and assistance to affected businesses and residents. Staff has compiled the following as a brief outline of important information:

- * The effective dates of the ordinance are as follows:
 - * August 9, 2012 for Grocery Stores, Food Vendors, Pharmacies, and City Facilities.
 - * November 9, 2012 for Retail Establishments, Vendors, and Non-Profit Vendors.
- * Paper bags are not restricted at this time. However, commercial/retail businesses must charge \$0.10 per paper bag if they choose to provide them, in an effort to encourage the use of reusable bags.





The installation of "Love My Bike!" stands by itself as a beautiful part of our on-going, privately-funded, creative energy of our community asset: "Cedros Avenue is in Tune". It offers an environmentally positive message: "Love My Bike / Love my Planet! Walk, bike, better than driving! For you, for the planet!"

"Love My Bike!" is a kinetic stainless steel sculpture 20' tall and 10' wide. The wind makes the wheels spin, the bike itself turns 360 degrees, and the sun reflects off its polished surfaces.

The artwork makes people smile and invokes feelings they have for their bikes: from memories of one's first bike and the sense of freedom it provided, to involvement with riding as a fun pastime, to fitness or a highly competitive sport, or to our reliance on them for transportation (accessible the world over, affordable and green).



El Viento at Granados Realignment and Lomas Santa Fe Sidewalks




To improve vehicle and pedestrian safety, the City has entered into a construction contract to realign El Viento at its intersection with North Granados, creating a single T-intersection with a 3-way stop. Previously, El Viento split into two roadways before intersecting North Granados, creating 3 intersections and a triangular island. The northerly segment of El Viento will be widened and reconstructed at a gentler grade. The southerly segment of El Viento will be removed and the excess right-of-way will be graded to create a small park with a walking path and a sitting area. Pedestrian access along El Viento will be improved with the addition of an asphalt sidewalk along the north side.

In addition to the roadway realignment, the existing undersized sewer main will be replaced in a more efficient alignment from Glenmont to Granados. Also, the lowering of the El Viento roadway near Granados requires the existing water main to be replaced, and one power pole will be relocated by SDG&E to accommodate the realignment.

As part of the project, the area on Lomas Santa Fe between Nardo and Granados, which currently has just narrow asphalt walking paths, will be replaced with wider concrete sidewalks, concrete curbs, and gutters. These improvements will improve pedestrian travel along Lomas Santa Fe Drive.

Please be patient and drive cautiously as traffic control and some detours will occur during construction. The project is anticipated to be completed by the end of August. For more information, please contact the Engineering Department at (858) 720-2470.



REMODELING/CONSTRUCTION

Summer is approaching again, and many of you will begin remodeling or construction projects on your homes. These are exciting times; however, there are things you should remember before you start. All construction activities are subject to environmental regulations. Stormwater Best Management Practices (BMPs) are required to control erosion and water run-off, even in the summer. Also, it is extremely important to remember that the actions of private contractors are ultimately the responsibility of the property owner. Therefore, you must ensure that anybody who is working on your home is aware of the storm water regulations and are adhering to them at all times. Stormwater violations are strictly enforced by the City and can result in fines. So, if you are unsure of the regulations and would like some assistance before you start your project, please feel free to call Taryn Dunbar at (858) 720-2487.

Green Building Recognition Program

In December 2009, Robert and Andra Fromme received approval from the City Council for a Development Review Permit and Structure Development Permit for an interior remodel and square footage addition to their existing residence at 638 Marsolan Drive. During the building permit process the Frommes participated in the City of Solana Beach's voluntary green building program that provides incentives for property owners to go through Build it Green's GreenPoint Rated program. On February 16, the project received the distinction of being GreenPoint Rated with a rating of 95 on the New Home Scale.

The remodeled home includes the following green building features:

- * Over 50% of the construction waste was diverted from the landfill through reuse and recycling.
- * Qualified as a high-energy performance home, exceeding California Title 24 requirements by 23.3%.
- * Achieved nearly double the minimum required points for GreenPoint Rated certification.
- * Low VOC (Volatile Organic Compounds) finishes and low emitting insulation for improved indoor air quality.
- * High efficiency dual flush toilets, low flow faucets, and low flow shower heads for water conservation.
- * High efficiency, sealed combustion furnace for improved indoor air quality.
- * Dual glazed Low E windows for improved comfort and reduced mechanical heating and cooling.
- * Energy Star energy efficient appliances.
- * Clothes washer plumbed for grey water irrigation system.
- * Door and window headers designed for the load, eliminating oversized materials and lumber waste
- * All floor and roof sheathing with Oriented Strand Board (OSB) made from small diameter, rapid growth lumber.
- * All beams, joists, and rafters are engineered members instead of conventional timber, reducing virgin lumber usage by up to 33%.
- * All interior walls sheathed with 5/8" thick gypsum board, increasing thermal mass.
- * Extended life, non-combustible roofing materials to improve durability, reduce material consumption and increase safety.
- * Detached garage eliminates potential of garage pollutants entering the home.
- * Over 75% of plantings are California Native species, requiring minimal supplemental irrigation beyond normal rainfall.
- * Landscape areas designed in hydrozones by grouping plants with similar water requirements.
- * Low flow drip, bubble, and rotary irrigation to reduce over spray and runoff.
- * Landscape beds mulched over 2" deep to reduce evaporation and retain moisture.
